The Royal College of Anaesthetists (RCoA) and Difficult Airway Society (DAS) are delighted to announce the fourth Airway Leads Day.


Join fellow airway leads from across the country to share best practice and address key topics including airway databases and changes to the curriculum and what it might mean for airway management.
