

Anaesthesia 2023 Poster Competition

Theme

You are invited to submit a poster for presentation at Anaesthesia 2023, on 16-18 May.

This year we are expanding the poster competition and inviting submissions on **innovation and workplace solutions** as well as **PQIP quality improvement and research category.** If you have worked on a project which falls into any of these categories, please submit a poster for a chance to showcase your work and to win a £250 voucher of your choice.

1) A quality improvement or research project using PQIP data and/or that addresses one of PQIP's top five priorities from the previous and current cohorts. (2019/20 and 2021/22):

- Individualised risk assessment
- DrEaMing and enhanced recovery
- Communication and multidisciplinary working
- Individualised pain Management
- Using data for improvement

2) A project which focuses on innovation in perioperative care services, pathways or ways of working, to support elective recovery and/or patient and/or staff experience and wellbeing

We are particularly keen to see entries which are describing an evaluation of a new or adapted innovation (e.g. a pathway, service, way of working or other innovation) in addition to describing what the innovation is. Evaluations could be qualitative (feedback from staff or patients for example), quantitative (numerical data on processes or outcomes) or both.

Eligibility

The competition is open to all healthcare professionals or student healthcare professionals.

Prize

1st prize: £250 voucher

All accepted posters will be invited to present their poster at the Conference with the top 5 invited to present as an oral presentation.

All accepted posters will also be published in the British Journal of Anaesthesia Open Access Journal, please see information below for submitting your abstract to them.

How to enter

- Submit a digital copy of your poster as an attachment to events@rcoa.ac.uk along with a signed copy of the form below.
- Please follow the poster preparation guidelines on page 2; failure to follow the guidelines could result in disqualification from the competition.

What happens next?

- The closing date for entries will be 23.59 Monday 20 March 2023.
- A panel of RCoA judges will assess all submissions shortly after the closing date. Authors will be notified by Monday
 17 April if they have been invited to display their poster at Anaesthesia 2023.
- All accepted posters will be invited to showcase their poster on the virtual platform.
- The selected winner will be given a slot to present their poster during the live programme.
- Authors selected to present their poster will need to book a place at the event in order to display their poster.

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Poster Preparation Guidelines

Key information

- Please note that only one author will be invited to present, though it is understood that other individuals may have contributed towards the poster content.
- Previously published work is not eligible. Work that has been presented at hospital, school, or regional meetings will be considered.
- Candidates will be required to pay to attend Anaesthesia 2023 to present their work.

Poster format:

- digital pptx / jpeg /png format
- landscape (horizontal) orientation
- 16:9 aspect ratio
- there is no word limit but posters should contain between one and five images, tables or graphs.
- we suggest using a presentation format (e.g. Powerpoint or Keynote) or an infographic maker

Posters must include:

- references; listed and cited as specified by the British Journal of Angesthesia
- a caption if a figure or picture or table is used
- acknowledgement of sources of funding
- the following statement (if applicable and true): "This study received ethics committee approval or was conducted under the Animal (Scientific Procedures) Act (1986) (include licence numbers) or equivalent"
- a content structure that progresses through: title, authors, institution(s), introduction, methods, results, conclusion, acknowledgements and references.

Other information:

- the presenting author will receive a certificate of presentation for producing and presenting a poster
 and may be entitled to claim CPD credits internally. You are advised to liaise with your appraiser. For

- The British Journal of Anaesthesia Open Access Journal will work with us to identify content they wish to publish. For those chosen the publishing fees will be waived. As part of this process, we ask that you submit your work as an abstract to p.m.hopkins@leeds.ac.uk following the instructions below.



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The British Journal of Anaesthesia Open Access Journal guidelines

If you wish to have an abstract of your poster considered for publication you must prepare and submit this according to the following instructions in addition to the submission of the digital copy of your poster.

Abstract preparation:

Abstracts should be prepared as a single page Word file formatted as follows:

- Paper size: A4
- Margins: all set at 2.5 cm
- Font: Times New Roman 12pt
- Line spacing: single

The content should include:

- Title
- Authors
- Author affiliations
- Text: separate paragraphs for Introduction, Methods, Results, Conclusion (for case reports use Introduction, Case details, Conclusion).
- One figure or table may be included but it must be embedded within the single page document. Any figure or table must have a legend/caption
- Reference list formatted as follows: 1st author name, et al. Abbreviated journal title year; volume: page numbers, e.g. Rueffert H, et al. Br J Anaesth 2021;126:120-30.
- Funding acknowledge any sources of external funding that have supported the work.

Abstract submission (deadline 30th March 2023):

- Please submit abstracts as an email attachment to p.m.hopkins@leeds.ac.uk
- The subject of the email should be "RCoA Conference Abstract Submission [your name]"
- In the body of the email please provide details of any relevant regulatory & governance approvals for publication of your work.
- Please copy (cc) all authors into the email to confirm that they have approved the submission.
