BACKGROUND

- Core/ACCS anaesthetics continues to be a popular specialty, with increasing numbers of applicants every year
- Competition ratios have increased from 1:2.6 in
 2020 to 1:6.4 in 2024, with 2025 seeing the
 highest number of applicants ever




Figure 1: A graph to show the number of applicants relative to the number of jobs over recent years¹

METHODS

- Our project aimed to provide **support and education** to **foundation trainees** across Wales, to maximise their chance of success at the complex process of applying to core training
- We sought guidance and support from the **Welsh School of Anaesthesia** to design a biannual conference aiming to enthuse and education Welsh foundation doctors

November 2024: All Wales Foundation Survey sent out and course design and development

4th December 2024: I st course run for 20 delegates

January - February 2025 : Feedback collated and second course planned

28th March 2025: 2nd iteration of course run for 30 delegates

PRE-COURSE SURVEY RESULTS



44% of attendees said they were unconfident with the application process for anaesthetics



17% were extremely unconfident



72% felt the access foundation doctors have to anaesthetics career advice is limited



92% had never attended an anaesthetics career session

Common themes applicants wanted covered included: portfolio optimisation, ACCS vs Core, life as an anaesthetists, ICM dual training

Areas of improvements: Handout of key points, links to faculty in local anaesthetic departments, contact emails to arrange taster weeks


