Overall role

- To attend two Committee meetings per year (one remotely via MS Teams, one as a hybrid meeting) as well as contributing proactively via e-mail to any additional matters the Committee are asked to consider.

Specific duties and responsibilities

- To provide critical analysis to the Committee on matters of ethics of relevance to the practice of anaesthesia, pain medicine and perioperative care.
- To contribute to Committee work including the provision of speakers, education and educational resources on ethics-related issues.
- To provide input where required to the RCoA Ethics Committee webpage, dedicated to ethical issues and the outputs of the Committee.
- To help produce regular Bulletin articles and blogs on ethical issues.
- To help develop and maintain relationships with members of ethics committees of external organisations such as other Medical Royal Colleges to support the work of the Committee.

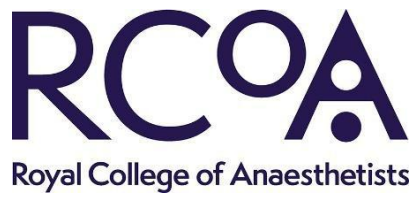
