With the change in name from *Continuing Education in Anaesthesia, Critical Care & Pain* (CEACCP) to *BJA Education* we further strengthen the educational platform provided by the BJA as a whole. The overall aim is to provide a greater linkage between BJA reviews and the well-established educational material provided by *BJA Education* (formerly known as CEACCP).

This will enhance the already broad international appeal of *BJA Education*. The journal has a bimonthly print circulation of 17,000 and online users from 181 countries. The *BJA Education* editorial team will be aiming to commission articles from an increasing number of international experts and the journal has also recently added international editors to the Editorial Board. New Users and Existing 'My Account' users

Once registered for a 'My Account' make sure you have activated your subscriber number. You can do this by:

1. Logging into your 'My Account' with your username and password.
2. Select "Manage Your Subscriptions" from the "My Account" page.
3. Enter your subscriber number in the box provided. This is the 8- or 12-digit number which can be obtained from the address sheet of your print copy journal or by emailing subs@rcoa.ac.uk. If a message says that your number has already been redeemed, you have already activated the number and you should be able to access the journal.
